Designed to support older adults in rural areas, this staff-driver program offers accessible van transportation, including options for individuals with mobility challenges that require wheelchair use.



**AGING IN PLACE
GOOD NEIGHBOR PROGRAM**
This staff-managed program connects older adults with local volunteer drivers, helping the aging population stay independent by providing rides to essential services that enhance their overall well-being.



Each Library

helps 60+Ride recruit Volunteers from the local area to help serve Older Adults in that specific community.

Each City

helps 60+Ride promote awareness through City channels and offer funding for transportation solutions needed by that City's aging population.

Each Senior Center

helps 60+Ride register Older Adults from the local area for FREE rides that can transport them to medical appointments, grocery shopping, and more.

Localize Volunteer Support

We need libraries to help develop a local volunteer pool in each city. It is easier and more cost-effective for us to provide timely rides when the driver lives in the same community as the passenger.

We believe that encouraging neighbors to help neighbors is an important way to create a close-knit support system and a caring community for Older Adults.

Bridge Transportation Gaps

We need strong partnerships with cities across Weld County, especially those in transportation deserts. Collaborating with local governments helps us serve the aging population and uplift the entire region.

By investing in 60 Plus Ride, each city strengthens its support for Older Adults, gains new resources, and tailors services to local needs. Our community-focused approach builds connections that help seniors thrive.

Offer Face-to-Face Access

We need senior centers to help us connect with Older Adults who may struggle with technology or prefer in-person assistance.

Many of today's Older Adults didn't grow up with computers, smart phones, or social media, and they often feel uncomfortable navigating the digital world. Senior centers can help ease technology concerns and provide the support needed to make registration for our free rides stress-free.

What Does ACCESS to Healthcare REALLY Look Like for Seniors in Weld County?

In Weld County, the journey to wellness often begins with something simple: a car door opened with care, a steady arm for balance, and a warm smile that says, "You're not alone."

At 60+ Ride, we don't just provide transportation. We offer dignity, companionship, and continuity of care. Our drivers are the first point of contact in a patient's journey to better health. We see what others don't. We witness the truth behind the numbers. We hear the stories behind the statistics. We believe it is our job to provide support for the quiet struggles, the fears, and the fragile moments. We notice the subtle signs that something may be going wrong and we offer the presence and support when it matters most.

5 Reasons Transit Deserts Exist in Weld County



1 Geography Isn't Friendly

Weld County covers more than 4,000 square miles—larger than the state of Rhode Island. Towns are often far apart, with long stretches of open highway in between. Older adults living in places like Pierce, Ault, or Platteville may be 20–40 miles from their nearest specialist or pharmacy.

- What we're doing: The Ten City Tour Project brings transportation services to these towns. We're coordinating with local leaders to create micro-networks that match local volunteers with local riders.

2 Isolation Is Invisible

Many older adults live independently on farms or in small homes on the outskirts of town. They may not appear in service data or seek help—until a crisis hits. Missed medical appointments and prescription refills often go unnoticed until it's too late.

- What we're doing: The Ten City Tour Project prioritizes relationship-building. Our Board members actively attend local events, our agency partners with trusted organizations, and we use a neighbor-to-neighbor approach to match caring people with their needs.

3 Lack of Public Transit

Most small towns in Weld County have little or no access to traditional public transportation. Bus lines rarely reach into rural or agricultural areas, and paratransit is often limited to city borders. Paid rides seldom originate their rides in remote areas.

- What we're doing: Our model uses volunteer drivers in personal vehicles who provide door-to-door service. By removing the need for costly infrastructure, we create scalable transportation solutions.

4 Local Infrastructure Doesn't Yet Exist

Even when transportation services are available, demand far outweighs the number of available drivers. Without a strong support system, volunteers can burn out from logistics and commitment.

- What we're doing: At every stop of the tour, we recruit drivers to offer flexible roles—from one-time drivers to regular route volunteers. We provide support circles so that volunteers feel connected and valued. We manage the logistics of every ride.

5 Communities Lack Local Coordination

In many towns, aging resources are spread thin. There may be a senior center in one location and a city office in another—with no bridge between them. As a result, older adults and caregivers don't always know where to turn for help.

- What we're doing: We help create that bridge. During each stop, we identify one hub for enrolling riders, one hub for recruiting drivers, and one liaison at the city level to keep communication flowing. It's a replicable model tailored to each community.

5 Things Every Doctor Needs to Know About Transportation

1 Transportation is a Health Determinant

Just like access to nutritious food or safe housing, access to transportation plays a critical role in a person's health. Without a reliable way to get to medical appointments, the pharmacy, or even physical therapy, many people, especially older adults, individuals with disabilities, and those living in rural communities—are left without the care they need. It's not that they don't want help; it's that getting there is often the hardest part.

2 "No-Show" Isn't Always Patient Noncompliance

When a patient misses an appointment, it's easy to assume they're simply not following through—but the reality is often more complicated. Many older adults and vulnerable individuals struggle with reliable transportation. It's not about unwillingness; it's about access. Getting to the doctor often proves to be the hardest part of following medical advice.

3 In-Clinic Questions Matter

"Do you have reliable transportation to get here and to the pharmacy?" It may seem like a small question, but it can uncover significant challenges your patient is quietly facing. Many people hesitate to speak up about transportation struggles—yet those struggles often lead to missed appointments, delayed care, and unmanaged conditions. By asking with care and listening without judgment, you create an opening to connect them with the help they need—right when they need it most.

4 Care Planning Must Include a How-To-Get-There Plan

When you're creating a care plan—whether it's scheduling follow-up visits, lab work, or ongoing treatment—it's important to ask: "How will my patient get there?" Even the most thoughtful plan can fall apart if transportation isn't part of the conversation. For many patients, especially older adults or those living alone, getting from home to healthcare isn't simple. By helping patients think through their transportation options, you're not just offering medical guidance...you're helping make their care truly accessible.

5 The Bottom Line

If transportation isn't part of the care conversation, you risk losing patients before treatment even begins. It's not just about getting from point A to point B. This is about access, dignity, and continuity of care. The good news? Solutions exist. By partnering with programs like 60 Plus Ride and keeping local transportation resources on hand, you can help bridge the transportation gap. A simple ride can be the first step toward better health—and together we have the power to make that step possible.

DRIVING CHANGE

Weld County is one of Colorado's largest and fastest-growing counties. It's rich in farmland, history, and hardworking people. But as the older adult population continues to grow, many communities remain physically disconnected from the services the people need most.

For older adults who no longer drive and for those who have never driven, access to transportation is the single most important factor in whether they can age in place with dignity. Yet for thousands of Weld County residents, the wheels have stopped turning.

60+ Ride is working to change transportation for older adults with a bold and simple idea: go where the need is.

Through a grassroots initiative called the Ten City Tour Project, we're visiting underserved communities to create local partnerships and build a volunteer driver network from the ground up.

Robin Blakely, Executive Director of 60 Plus Ride, says, "Transportation deserts happen when remote communities lack access to sustainable systems. At 60 Plus Ride, we have the infrastructure in place to support volunteer-driven transportation. But the real magic is when our system connects to the people who need transportation most."

The Ten City Tour Project is about building local partnerships, uncovering and optimizing community strengths, and proving that with the right support, independence is possible at any age.

We Recognize Emotional Distress Hidden in Plain Sight



Imagine sitting with a breast cancer survivor as she goes to be fitted for a post-surgery bra that needs to be tailored to her changing body. She's anxious. It is a vulnerable, deeply personal moment. She doesn't have a sister or daughter to take her.

But our driver is there. Kind. Patient. Present.

Why it matters: These quiet moments of connection are care. Kindness reduces fear, affirms dignity, and helps older adults feel seen and supported on every level—physically, emotionally, and spiritually.

One ride provided access to what she needed to start living her life again.



It's time to understand that the road to better health begins with reliable transportation

For millions of older adults and vulnerable patients, getting to a doctor's appointment, the pharmacy, or even a lab isn't just a matter of scheduling. It's a serious challenge. Transportation is one of the most quietly devastating barriers to healthcare. It's rarely discussed in the exam room, yet its absence ripples through nearly every aspect of a patient's wellbeing.

Missed appointments. Delayed treatments. Unmanaged chronic conditions. Even preventable hospital stays. These issues can be blamed on a patient's unwillingness to follow through. More often than not, the real problem is something far simpler and far more urgent: they just couldn't get there.

"When transportation is out of reach, so is care," says Robin Blakely, Executive Director of 60 Plus Ride. "Our drivers are often the first point of contact in a patient's journey to wellness. 60 Plus Ride offers more than just a ride. We provide observation, encouragement, and a sense of connection that supports both physical and emotional health."

Because We Listen, Everything Changes

Why it matters: Loneliness doesn't always look like tears of sadness. Sometimes, loneliness just needs an open seat and a willing ear. That small connection reminded this older adult that she still mattered—and that her stories still had a place in the world.

One day she asked if the driver could take an alternate route that passed her old neighborhood. When they arrived, her eyes lit up.

She shared how she'd planted the trees in the yard, now tall and full of color. Then came the stories—how much she had in common with the driver, except the one on the corner, the holiday lights that won the spirit prize, the way she used to wear her hair. Dozens of memories came rushing back.

For a little while, with a driver who cared enough to listen, she didn't just remember her life. She lived it again through a simple car ride.



We need to formalize our working arrangements.


**First, let's do a Q-and-A presentation for your team.




